<u>Bid Overview</u>: The purpose of this Invitation to Bid (Bid) is to describe the requirements of Chad Chronister, the Sheriff of Hillsborough County, a Constitutional Officer of the State of Florida (Sheriff) to secure a vendor for the collection and proper disposal of spent ammunition from multiple range sites.

Any reference to the "Work" throughout this bid packet is defined to be inclusive of the Scope of Work and any related performance detailed herein.

MANDATORY PRE-BID SITE VISIT AND FACILITY TOUR – This site visit must be attended.

PART A - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. <u>BIDS</u>: Must be contained in a SEALED envelope addressed to: Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office, Sheriff's Operations Center, Financial Services Division – Purchasing Section, 2008 East 8th Avenue, Tampa, Florida 33605. <u>To prevent inadvertent opening, the Bid must be marked as a BID DOCUMENT (including the Bid number, date, and time of Bid opening) on the outside of the package.</u>

If our specifications, when included, are not returned with your Bid, and no specific reference is made to them in your BID RESPONSE (PART D), it will be assumed that all specifications will be met. When material, sketches, cuts, descriptive literature, company's or manufacturer's specifications which accompany the BID RESPONSE (PART D), contain information that can be construed or is intended to be a deviation from our specifications, such deviation must be specifically referenced in your BID RESPONSE, *Exceptions* (PART D, Paragraph 1).

- 2. <u>BID DELIVERY</u>: The responsibility for getting the Bid to the HCSO on or before the stated time and date will be solely and strictly the responsibility of the Bidder. The HCSO will in no way be responsible for delays caused by the United States Postal Service or a delay caused by any other occurrence, or any other method of delivery. The Bidder shall be responsible for reading very carefully and understanding completely the requirements in the specifications. Bids will not be accepted after the time specified for receipt.
- 3. <u>ON-LINE DOCUMENTS</u>: The HCSO publishes procurement-related documents on its website at https://TeamHCSO.com/Purchasing for the convenience of companies wanting to do business with the HCSO and to save tax dollars. This service is public record and the HCSO is responsible only for documents as published. Any modifications or alterations to the original document language may be cause for rejection of a bid.
- 4. <u>TIME FOR CONSIDERATION</u>: Bidder warrants, by virtue of bidding, the prices quoted in their response will be good for an evaluation period of 60 calendar days from the date of bid opening unless otherwise stated. <u>Bidders will not be allowed to withdraw or modify their Bids after the opening time and date.</u>
- 5. <u>PRICES</u>: All bids submitted must show the <u>net bid price</u> after any and all discounts allowable have been deducted. **Prices quoted are to be F.O.B. Destination**. All prices shall include freight (to include manufacturer to distributor), packaging, and any other similar fees. The HCSO is exempt from all state sales, use, transportation, and excise taxes. The HCSO will issue tax exemption certificates to the Awarded Vendor.

The Bidder's attention is directed to the laws of the State of Florida including, but not limited to, Chapter 212, Florida Statutes, which applies to all transactions resulting from this Bid, and that all applicable taxes and fees shall be deemed to have been included in the BID RESPONSE (PART D) as part of the materials cost, when applicable.

6. <u>BID ERRORS</u>: When errors are found in the extension of bid prices, the unit price will govern. Bids having erasures or corrections must be initialed in ink by the Bidder.

- 7. <u>CONDITION OF MATERIALS AND PACKAGING</u>: Unless otherwise indicated, it is understood and agreed that any commodity offered or shipped on this Bid shall be NEW and in FIRST CLASS CONDITION or FIRST QUALITY, that all containers shall be NEW and suitable for storage or shipment, and that prices include standard commercial packaging for the items shipped.
- 8. <u>CLAIMS</u>: The Awarded Vendor will immediately replace missing or damaged items and will be responsible for making any and all claims against carriers.
- 9. <u>WHEN TO MAKE DELIVERY</u>: Deliveries resulting from this Bid are to be made during the normal working hours of the HCSO. It is the Bidder's responsibility to obtain this information.
- 10. <u>INFORMATION AND DESCRIPTIVE LITERATURE</u>: Bidders must furnish all information requested in the Bid. If specified, each Bidder must submit samples, cuts, sketches, descriptive literature, and/or complete specifications covering the products offered. Reference to literature submitted with previous responses will not satisfy this provision. Bids which do not comply with these requirements will be subject to rejection.
- 11. <u>BID SUBMITTAL COSTS</u>: Submittal of a Bid is solely at the cost of the Bidder and the HCSO in no way is liable or obligates itself for any cost incurred by the Bidder in preparing the Bid Package.
- 12. <u>NO BID</u>: If you do not wish to submit a response to the Bid, please return the STATEMENT OF NO BID herein as APPENDIX II. The "No Bid" information is helpful to the process and assures the HCSO you wish to remain on the HCSO Vendor List.
- 13. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT (OSHA)</u>: The Bidder certifies that all material/items contained in their response meets all OSHA requirements.
- 14. <u>LAWS, STATUTES, AND ORDINANCES</u>: The terms and conditions of the Bid and the resulting Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws and statutes of the state of Florida and ordinances and other regulations of Hillsborough County. Where such statutes and regulations are referenced, they shall be interpreted to apply to this Bid and to the resulting Agreement. While the Sheriff is not bound by Chapter 287, *Florida Statutes*, in the spirit of fair dealing and just opportunity, the HCSO endeavors to meet the directives and business practices articulated in the Chapter.

The Bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, codes, rules and regulations shall apply to the contract throughout and they will be deemed to be included in the contract the same as though herein written. Florida law will govern all questions concerning implementation and execution of this contract and shall also be controlling in any cause of action brought pursuant to this contract.

The Awarded Vendor agrees that it shall observe and obey all the laws, ordinances, regulations and rules of the Federal, State, County and City which may be applicable to its services.

- 15. <u>FAMILIARITY WITH LAW</u>: The Bidder is required to be familiar with all Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, rules, codes and regulations that in any manner affect the work. Ignorance on the part of the Bidder will in no way relieve him from responsibility.
- 16. <u>ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION</u>: The HCSO reserves the right to reject any or all bids, for cause, to waive irregularities, if any, and to accept the Bid (or Bids) which, in the judgment of the Sheriff, are in the best interest of the HCSO. The HCSO reserves the right to evaluate, add, and/or reject any items from any bid options or resulting contract(s) when deemed to be in the best interest of the HCSO.
- 17. <u>APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS</u>: The HCSO, as an entity of local government, is subject to the appropriation of funds by the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners in an amount sufficient to allow continuation of its performance in accordance with the terms and conditions of any contract entered into as a result of this Bid for each and every fiscal year following the fiscal year in which this Contract is executed and entered into, and for which the Contract shall remain in effect. The HCSO shall, upon receipt of notice that sufficient funds are not available to continue its full and faithful performance under the Contract, provide prompt written notice of such event and effective 30 calendar days after the giving of such notice, or upon the expiration of the period of time for which funds were appropriated, whichever occurs first, be thereafter released of all further obligations in any way related to such Contract.
- 18. <u>PROTESTS</u>: Any Bidder who disputes the reasonableness or appropriateness of the notice of award, or notice of rejection, for any or all Bids must submit a notice of protest in writing within 72 hours (excluding HCSO holidays, Saturdays and Sundays) of the notice of award to the HCSO Purchasing Section by registered mail or hand delivery for which a receipt must be provided.
 - A. The HCSO will have five (5) business days upon receipt of the notice to review and consider the protest as written. The Buyer will coordinate the review process with the parties involved and may request additional information from the Bidder or request a meeting to gain further clarification of the issues. Upon completion of this review process, the Buyer will make a recommendation to the Chief Financial Officer (CFO).
 - B. The CFO may concur with the recommendation or arrive at a separate decision. The decision of the CFO will be communicated to the Bidder in writing. This decision, and the basis upon which it was made, will be communicated to the Bidder within five (5) business days following the receipt of the recommendation from the Purchasing Section. A single appeal of the CFO's decision is available by submitting a notice in writing within 72 hours (excluding HCSO holidays, Saturdays and Sundays) requesting a management review of the decision. Final decision of an appeal will be made by the Sheriff.

19. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: The Awarded Vendor will indemnify and hold harmless the HCSO and its employees and agents from and against all liabilities, claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from the performance of its Work, provided that any such liability, claim, damage, loss, or expense is (a) attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than the Work itself), including the loss of use resulting there from and (b) is cause in whole, or in part, by the act or omission of the Awarded Vendor, any Subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, whether or not it is caused in whole, or in part, by a party indemnified hereunder.

In any and all claims against the HCSO or any of its agents or employees by any employee of the Bidder, any Subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, the indemnification obligation under the previous paragraph shall not be limited in any way as to the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for the Bidder or any Subcontractor under worker's compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

20. <u>PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES</u>: Pursuant to §§287.132-133, *Fla. Stats.*, the HCSO, as a public entity, may not accept any bid, proposal or reply from, award any contract to, or transact any business in excess of the threshold amount provided in §287.017, *Fla. Stat.*, for Category Two (\$35,000) with any person or affiliate on the convicted vendor list for a period of 36 months from the date that the person or affiliate was placed on the convicted vendor list, unless that person or affiliate has been removed from the list pursuant to §287.133 (3)(f), *Fla. Stat.* If you submit a proposal in response to this Bid, you are certifying that §§287.132-.133, *Fla. Stats.*, does not restrict your submission.

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21. <u>PUBLIC RECORDS</u>: Any material submitted in response to this Bid will become a public document pursuant to §119.07, Fla. Stat. This includes material which the respondent might consider to be confidential or a trade secret. Any claim of confidentiality is waived upon submission, effective after opening pursuant to §119.07, Fla. Stat. The Bidder agrees to comply with §119.0701, Fla. Stat., regarding maintenance and provision of access to all public records generated by this Contract with the HCSO.

The HCSO requires that, at the conclusion of the selection process, the contents of all bids be placed in the public domain and be open to inspection by interested parties. Any restrictions on the use of data contained within a bid must be clearly stated in the Bid itself. Proprietary information submitted in response to the Bid will be handled in accordance with applicable Florida Statutes.

PART B - SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. <u>COMMUNICATION BETWEEN PARTIES</u>: All questions in regard to this Bid are to be directed, in writing, to the Buyer as listed on page 2, *Instructions to Bidders*. No communication is allowed, either directly or indirectly, with any other HCSO employee in regard to this Bid prior to the notice of award.

In the interest of public access, all documents relating to this Bid will be posted to the HCSO website at https://TeamHCSO.com/Purchasing. This will include Question & Answer (Q&A), amendments, addenda, etc. Posting documents to the HCSO website is considered the official method of notification regardless of other notification methods the Buyer utilizes for convenience of the parties involved.

- 2. <u>THE VENDOR PACKET</u>: The completed APPENDIX I must be returned with your Bid Response along with copies of Hillsborough County Business Tax Receipt, other local government, or state business license(s).
- 3. <u>BIDDER QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Bids shall be considered only from those who can clearly demonstrate to the HCSO a professional ability to perform the type of work specified within the Bid. Bidders must be able to demonstrate adequate organization, financial backing, equipment and personnel to ensure continuous provision of quality service to the HCSO. In the determination of the evidence of responsibility and ability to perform the contract by the Bidder, the HCSO reserves the right to investigate the financial condition, experience and training records, personnel, equipment, facilities and organization of the Bidder. The HCSO shall determine whether the evidence of responsibility and ability to perform is satisfactory, and will make awards only when such evidence is deemed satisfactory. The Sheriff reserves the right to reject a Bid when evidence indicates the inability to perform the work specified within the Bid.
- 4. <u>BACKGROUND CHECKS</u>: The HCSO requires the Awarded Vendor to conduct background checks of its employees, agents, representatives, and subcontractors that will be working on HCSO property. The cost of the background checks will be borne by the Awarded Vendor. The HCSO may require the Awarded Vendor to exclude the Awarded Vendor's employees, agents, representatives, or subcontractors based on the background check results. In addition, the Awarded Vendor must ensure that all persons have a responsibility to self-report to the Awarded Vendor within three (3) calendar days any arrest for any disqualifying offense. In this instance, "disqualifying offense" means an offense that is a felony or that has a direct nexus to an individual's proposed or current field of licensure, certification, or employment. The Awarded Vendor must notify the Project Manager within twenty-four (24) hours of all details concerning any reported arrest. Upon the request of the HCSO, the Awarded Vendor will re-screen any of its employees, agents, representatives, and subcontractors during the term of the Contract.

- 5. E-VERIFY REQUIREMENT: Pursuant to §448.095, Fla. Stat., the Sheriff requires the Awarded Vendor, and any and all subcontractors, if permitted by agreement, to register with and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all newly hired employees. If the Awarded Vendor enters into a contract with a subcontractor, the subcontractor must provide the Awarded Vendor with an affidavit stating that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with an unauthorized alien. The Awarded Vendor shall maintain a copy of such affidavit for the duration of the contract. If the Sheriff has a good faith belief that the Awarded Vendor has knowingly violated §448.09(1), Fla. Stat., the contract will be terminated. If the Sheriff has a good faith belief that a subcontractor knowingly violated this subsection, but the Awarded Vendor otherwise complied with this subsection, the Sheriff will promptly notify the Awarded Vendor and order the Awarded Vendor to immediately terminate the contract with the subcontractor. Termination of any and all contracts and/or sub-contracts as provided above, does not constitute a breach of contract and may not be considered as such. If the Sheriff terminates a contract with an Awarded Vendor as provided above, the Awarded Vendor may not be awarded a contract for at least one (1) year after the date on which the contract was terminated. The Awarded Vendor is liable for any additional costs incurred by the Sheriff as a result of the termination of a contract.
- 6. <u>SUBCONTRACTING</u>: The Awarded Vendor may not sublet or subcontract any of the contractual obligations concerning this bid matter except as provided for in the written contract between the HCSO and Awarded Vendor. This statement prohibits subcontracting overall management obligations pertaining to the work and requires the Awarded Vendor to retain ultimate liability for all contractual obligations.
- 7. <u>CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE</u>: No Work shall commence in connection with this Contract until the Awarded Vendor and any Subcontractor(s) have met the insurance requirements listed below and obtained approval of such by the HCSO. These policies, obtained at the Contractor's own expense, shall show Chad Chronister, Sheriff, as additional named insured; include the severability of interest provision; provide that all liability coverage required under contract are primary to any liability insurance carried or any self-insured programs of the Sheriff; and shall be maintained throughout the life of this Contract. All insurance policies shall be with insurers qualified and doing business in the state of Florida. The HCSO must be notified within sixty calendar days of cancellation, non-renewal, or change in the insurance coverage.

A. <u>Worker's Compensation Insurance</u>: Worker's Compensation Insurance must meet statutory minimum requirements for all employees connected with the Work of this project and in case any Work is sublet, the Awarded Vendor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Worker's Compensation Insurance for all the latter's employees unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Awarded Vendor. Such insurance shall comply fully with the Florida Worker's Compensation Law. In case any hazardous Work under this Contract at the site of the project is not protected under the Worker's Compensation statute, the Awarded Vendor shall provide, and cause each subcontractor to provide, adequate insurance satisfactory to the HCSO for the protection of their employees not otherwise protected. The minimum amounts required are as follows:

Employer's Liability: \$100,000 Limit each Accident

\$500,000 Limit each Aggregate

\$100,000 Limit Disease each employee

B. <u>Contractors Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance</u>: Comprehensive General Liability Insurance (including operations, completed operations, products, contractual, and owners and contractors protective liability) and Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance which shall protect the Contractor from claims for damage and personal injury, including accidental death, as well as claims for property damage which may arise from operations under this Contract whether such operations be by the Contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by the Contractor shall be the minimum limits as follows:

Comprehensive General \$300,000 bodily injury and property damage combined single limit
 Automobile \$300,000 bodily injury and property damage combined single limit.

C. <u>Professional Liability Insurance</u>: Professional Liability Insurance shall meet the following minimum amounts:

- 1. \$500,000 per occurrence; and
- 2. \$1,000,000 aggregate.

D. <u>Comprehensive Insurance Coverage</u>: Comprehensive General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance which shall protect the Contractor from claims for damage for personal injury, including accidental death, as well as claims for property damage which may arise from operations under this Contract whether such operations be by the Contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by the Contractor. The minimum amounts of such insurance shall be as follows:

Commercial/Comprehensive General Liability:

1. Bodily Injury \$300,000 per person per occurrence

2. Property Damage \$300,000 per occurrence

3. Automobile Liability \$300,000 combined single limit bodily

injury and property damage

4. Garage Liability \$1,000,000 combined single limit each

occurrence

5. Garage Keepers Liability \$100,000 collision and comprehensive per

vehicle

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- 8. MANUFACTURER'S NAME: Any manufacturers' names, trade names, brand names information, and/or catalog numbers when furnished are for the purpose of description, reference, and establishing general quality levels. Such references are not intended to be restrictive and products of any manufacturer may be offered if they are approved as equals. The determination as to whether any alternate product or service is or is not equal shall be made by the HCSO and such determination shall be final and binding upon all Proposers. The HCSO will not allow substitutions to the brand name, model number or the configuration of the requested equipment or service unless authorized in writing. All items not specifically mentioned but which are standard factory items shall be included. Manufacturer's specification sheets shall be furnished upon request.
- 9. <u>CONFLICT OF INTEREST</u>: The Bidder agrees to disclose any organizational conflict of interest, perceived or real, for evaluation of HCSO's compliance with §112.313, *Fla. Stat.*, regarding standards of conduct for public officers, employees of agencies, and local government attorneys.
 - No HCSO employee acting in an official capacity, as a purchasing agent, or public officer, shall either directly or indirectly purchase, rent, or lease any realty, goods, or services for HCSO from any business entity of which the officer, partner, director, or proprietor, or in which such officer or employee or the officer's or employee's spouse or child, or any combination thereof, has a material (>5%) interest. An officer or employee is also prohibited from having an employment or contractual relationship that creates a continuing or recurring conflict between their private interest and the performance of their HCSO public duties.
- 10. <u>AWARD</u>: Award shall be made to the most responsive Bid and responsible Bidder meeting specifications, price and other factors considered. Award may be made to more than one (1) Bidder to ensure that Work is completed in a timely manner.
 - A. Award will be dependent upon the determination that the Bids are responsive, Bidders are responsible, evaluation criteria stated in the Bid document and any other evaluation criteria deemed relevant and beneficial. Bids and Bidders determined to be deficient in either responsiveness or responsibility may be rejected without further evaluation. Tabulation of the Bid prices and Bidder rankings, if applicable, will be published at the time of Award.
 - B. Notification of Award will be sent to the Bidder receiving the Award. Bid results will be published on the HCSO website: https://TeamHCSO.com/Purchasing.
- 11. <u>BID OPENING</u>: The Bid Opening will *not* be open to the public. Bids will be received until the time and date listed herein and will be read aloud immediately thereafter at the "Place" indicated. A video recording of the Bid opening will then be posted to the HCSO website https://TeamHCSO.com/Purchasing.
 - A. Bids must be received by the HCSO Purchasing Section no later than the time and date shown within this Bid document. Bidders mailing their Bid Packages should allow for normal mail time to ensure receipt by HCSO prior to the time and date fixed for the acceptance of the bids. Bids or unsolicited amendments to bids, received by the HCSO after the acceptance date will not be considered.

- B. The HCSO reserves the right to postpone the date for receipt and opening of bids or other deadlines and will make a reasonable effort to give at least five (5) calendar days' notice of any such postponement to each prospective Bidder.
- C. It is understood and agreed upon by the Bidder in submitting a Bid Package that the HCSO has the right to withhold all information regarding this procurement until after contract award, including but not limited to: the number of Bids received; competitive technical information; competitive price information; and the HCSO evaluation concerns about competing Bids. Information released after award is subject to the disclosure requirements of the Chapter 119, *Fla. Stat.* Bidders are enjoined from discussing or disclosing the content of any Bid with competing Bidders during the evaluation and negotiation process.
- 12. <u>ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION</u>: The HCSO reserves the right to reject any or all Bids, for cause, to waive irregularities, if any, and to accept the Bid (or Bids) which, in the judgment of the Sheriff, are in the best interest of the HCSO. The HCSO reserves the right to evaluate, add, and/or reject any items from any Bid options or resulting contract(s) when deemed to be in the best interest of the HCSO.
- 13. <u>CONTRACT PERIOD</u>: The Contract shall be effective for two (2) years from the date of award. By written mutual consent between the HCSO and the Vendor, the Contract may be extended on an annual basis for up to two (2) additional two (2) year periods.
- 14. <u>ESCALATION/DE-ESCALATION</u>: The HCSO will allow an escalation/de-escalation provision in this Bid. The escalation/de-escalation will be allowed provided the Awarded Vendor(s) notify the HCSO's Financial Services Division of the pending increase or decrease a minimum of 60 calendar days prior to the end of each two (2) year period for which the Bid was awarded. Said notification shall consist of manufacturer's proof of increase and shall include each individual item, the amount of increase/decrease, and the applicable Bid Item Number. Failure to comply with these instructions shall be grounds for disallowance of the escalation/de-escalation clause as stated herein.
- 15. <u>ADDITION/DELETION</u>: The HCSO reserves the right to add or delete any items from this Bid or resulting Contract(s) when deemed to be in the best interest of the HCSO. Any additions or deletions to the Bid will be considered amendments. Any additions or deletions to the Contract will constitute a Change Order and must be executed in writing and approved by the Chief Financial Officer (CFO). The Change Order will consist of a memo to the CFO describing the justification for the item addition accompanied by the Awarded Vendor's written, fixed price quote for each item to be added. If approved by the CFO, the item will be added to the Contract and recorded on the original Bid tabulation/price sheet.
- 16. <u>CANCELATION</u>: When deemed to be in the best interest of the HCSO, any contract(s) resulting from this Bid may be canceled by the following means:
 - 1) 10 calendar days' written notice with cause, or;
 - 2) 30 calendar days' written notice without cause.

If it becomes necessary to terminate the Contract without cause, all items and/or materials provided through the date of receipt of written notice of cancelation may be invoiced to the

HCSO, and will be considered for payment providing documentation of said expenses are forwarded with the request for payment. An award may be made to the next best responsive Bid and responsible Bidder based on evaluation, or articles specified may be purchased on the open market similar to those so terminated.

- 17. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: The Awarded Vendor will not assign, transfer, convey, or otherwise dispose of this contract or any part thereof, or of its right title or interest therein or its power to execute this contract or any amendment or modification hereto, to any other person, company or corporation, without prior written consent of the HCSO. Sale of a majority of corporate stocks, filing for bankruptcy or reorganization shall be considered an assignment.
- 18. <u>DEFAULT</u>: The Contract may be canceled or nullified by the HCSO's CFO in whole, or in part, by written notice of default to the Awarded Vendor(s) upon non-performance or violation of Contract terms. An award may be made to the next best responsive Bid and responsible Bidder based on evaluation, or articles specified may be purchased on the open market similar to those so terminated. Failure of the Awarded Vendor to deliver materials, or items within the time stipulated in this Bid, unless extended in writing by the Financial Services Division, shall constitute Contract default. Awarded Vendors who default on contracts may be removed from the HCSO Vendor List and determined ineligible for future contracts at the discretion of the CFO.
- 19. <u>NEXT BEST BIDDER</u>: In the event of a default by the Awarded Vendor, or cancelation by HCSO, the HCSO reserves the right to utilize the next best responsive Bid and responsible Bidder. In the event of this occurrence, the new Awarded Vendor shall be required to provide the Bid items at the prices as contained in their BID RESPONSE (PART D), for the remainder of the award period.
- 20. <u>DELIVERY</u>: Product(s) ordered shall be delivered in accordance with estimated time for delivery identified in BID RESPONSE (PART D), if indicated. Failure to do so shall be considered a breach of Contract or default and the HCSO may utilize its options as stated herein.
 - Any backordered product(s) shall be made available within ten (10) calendar days of the time of backorder (original date of receipt). If the backorder cannot be filled within the time frame of this requirement, the HCSO's Purchasing section shall be notified, in writing, thus permitting the HCSO to obtain the required materials/items and/or exercise its options as stated herein.
- 21. <u>EMERGENCY</u>: If and when an emergency requirement should occur, the HCSO reserves the right to deviate from this Contract and procure the item(s) from the most available source.
- 22. <u>INVOICING AND PAYMENTS:</u> The Vendor will invoice the HCSO for Work as completed. At a minimum, an invoice shall include the Work site address, description of Work completed or list of goods received, and the Purchase Order number. Applications for payment will be required for partial payments or progress payments and are acceptable in lieu of an invoice if numbered. Any reimbursement for recycle of lead and brass should be identified as a separate line item on any invoice and be accompanied by a LEAD & BRASS RECYCLING PROCEEDS SUMMARY to include all supporting documentation.

It is a requirement of the HCSO to have the Project Manager review and approve all applications for payment and invoices prior to the HCSO remitting payment.

Payment shall be made in accordance with Chapter 218, Part VII, *Florida Statutes*, which states the vendor's rights and the HCSO's responsibilities concerning interest penalties and time limits for payment of invoices. Timely payment of invoices is incumbent upon the HCSO and in no case shall payment exceed 45 calendar days from date of receipt of a properly approved application/invoice.

23. EXCEPTIONS TO BID: All Bid Responses must clearly state with specific detail all deviations to the requirements imposed upon the Bid by the GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS (PART A), SPECIAL PROVISIONS (PART B) and SPECIFICATIONS (PART C). Such deviations should be stated upon the BID RESPONSE (PART D), or appended thereto. 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PART C - SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. <u>IN GENERAL</u>: The HCSO has three locations requiring lead removal and cleaning services. The first location is the Walter C. Heinrich Practical Training Site (WCHPTS) located at 14063 County Road 39, Lithia, Florida 33547. The WCHPTS is a 200-acre facility that includes multiple outdoor ranges, one indoor range, one Bomb Berm area, one Sniper Tower, and two Shoot Houses. Each location listed below utilizes granular rubber bullet traps with the exception of Range #6 which utilizes a steel bullet trap.
 - a. Dark House is approximately 55 feet wide.
 - b. Range #1 is approximately 118 feet wide.
 - c. Range #2 is approximately 60 feet wide.
 - d. Range #3 is approximately 135 feet wide.
 - e. Range #4 is approximately 114 feet wide.
 - f. Range #5 is approximately 166 feet wide.
 - g. Range #6 is approximately 118 feet wide.

Ranges #7 and #8, the Bomb Berm Area, the Sniper Tower and the two Shoot Houses do not utilize bullet traps and only require brass collection.

The second location is the Indoor Range located at Pinebrooke 2, 1208 Tech Boulevard, Suite 102, Tampa, Florida 33619. This location has a single 26' granular rubber bullet trap. The Indoor Range will include a Filtration Air Unit (FAU) system check, filter replacements as required, and clean/vacuum of facility. See Exhibit A1, Careys Floor Plan, and Exhibit A2, Careys Building Section for more specific Indoor Range information.

The third location is at the HCSO Crime Scene Unit located at 2416 N. Falkenburg Rd, Tampa, FL 33619. This location has a single water-filled shoot tank for evidence testing. The shoot tank room will need a Dlead wipe down and vacuuming of all surfaces. HCSO will maintain all filters and required filter changes.

2. <u>SPECIFICATIONS AND SCOPE OF WORK</u>: The general Scope of Work is for: the proper collection, removal, and testing of spent ammunition; cleaning, inspection, and service of traps; the proper disposal/recycling of hazardous and non-hazardous materials; and replacement of the granular rubber where necessary at both the indoor and outdoor firing ranges.

The Vendor shall meet all regulatory governing bodies' standards or regulations (including but not limited to Federal, State, Local, Environmental, etc.) related to the collection and disposal of lead ammunition and recycling. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Vendor to perform all Work to meet and/or exceed the regulations for this type of lead removal and disposal, to include, all protection to individuals working on site. The Vendor shall be responsible for any work performed that does not meet regulations and requirements. Any fines associated with deficient work shall be the responsibility of the Vendor.

3. <u>ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: It shall be the Vendor's responsibility to provide Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved 55-gallon sealable drums. The HCSO requests a minimum of 23 drums on-site in accordance with Part D, Para. 4(d)(i) below.

The Vendor shall be responsible to provide all supplies and materials used for cleaning of the traps, the appropriate Personal Protection Equipment (PPE), and any other equipment and supplies as necessary for the completion of the Work.

All cleaning materials, supplies and the PPE used for cleaning of the traps shall be placed in 55-gallon drums, sealed, numbered and dated, and tested as required. The Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP) will determine whether the material is hazardous or non-hazardous using the EPA guidelines. All materials, both hazardous and non-hazardous, shall be disposed of/recycled, in accordance with the EPA guidelines, as required. Copies of the TCLP report shall be supplied to the HCSO Project Manager or their designee.

Testing fees should include all aspects of the process such as but not limited to, labor, shipping, media, samples, and report generation. If testing results exceed the EPA guidelines, then the Vendor shall provide the necessary documentation and procedure(s) in writing, within 10 days, that shall be taken by the Vendor and/or the HCSO.

4. SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

- a. Ranges #1, #2, #3, #4 and #5 Granular Rubber Traps:
 - i. Every three (3) months, prior to raking the front slope, Vendor shall clean all foreign debris from the granular rubber surface. The debris shall be stored in 55-gallon drums, sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required. The Vendor shall use cleaned and raked out granular rubber to refill hopper bins. The front granular rubber slope shall be smooth with no excess material build up or depressions across the entire front face of the trap. The HCSO will have additional granular rubber stored on site and available to replenish traps and top off the hopper bins, as required.
 - ii. At the rear/back area of each trap, the Vendor shall clean all debris of paper, broken or splintered wood stakes, etc. The debris shall be stored in 55-gallon drums that are sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required.
 - iii. Every six (6) months, prior to the lead removal process of the trap, the Vendor shall clean all debris from the granular rubber surfaces and place in 55-gallon drums that are sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required. The Vendor shall completely remove granular rubber from trap structure and proceed with lead removal. The Vendor shall replenish traps and hoppers with the clean granular rubber material as well as any additional material that may be needed. The front granular rubber slope shall be smooth with no excess material build up or depressions across the entire front face of the trap.

b. Range #6 Steel Trap:

- i. Every three (3) months, the Vendor shall clean up debris behind all target locations of paper, broken or splintered wood material, etc. The debris shall be stored in 55-gallon drums that are sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required.
- ii. Every six (6) months, the Vendor shall clean and vacuum the entire interior of the steel trap, bottom, and top plates. The Vendor shall vacuum the lead collection in the point area. All debris shall be placed in 55-gallon drums that are sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required.

c. <u>Indoor Range</u>, <u>Dark House and Crime Scene Shoot tank</u>:

i. The ventilation systems are designed to filter airborne lead and other contaminants before exhausting to the outdoors. With time, the pre-filters and High Efficiency Particulate Air (HEPA) filters will become lead contaminated. ONLY personnel trained in lead removal shall be used by the Vendor to work and replace these filters.

The pre-filters shall be replaced based on hours of operation. The default changing set point is programmed into the Direct Digital Control (DDC) system based on average hours of operation. The DDC system will produce warning lights when the system run time hours pass the set point for changing the pre-filters and will produce messages to replace the filters on the computer screen. If the pre-filters are not replaced and pass their physical limit set point as determined by differential static pressure or "pressure drop," the system will produce an alarm. It is important to replace the pre-filters at regular intervals in order to extend the life of the HEPA filters. As pre-filters become loaded, they allow more dirt to pass through until they eventually collapse. Pre-filters have an exponential curve, and will load gradually over 90% of their life cycle, and then very quickly load the remaining 10%.

- iii. Indoor Range service required every three (3) months, review the Operating Analysis System of the computer for errors and messages, which relates to the exterior Filtration Air Unit (FAU). The Vendor must inspect the FAU for any filters requiring replacement, per the recommended programmed schedule, and replace all dirty filters. The inside of the Range shall be completely cleaned of debris and vacuumed, including the entire interior and all six (6) target locations. The debris shall be stored in 55-gallon drums that are sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required.
- iv. <u>Dark House service required every three (3) months</u>, review the Operating Analysis System of the computer for errors and messages, which relates to the exterior FAU. The Vendor must inspect the FAU for any filters requiring replacement, per the recommended programmed schedule, and replace all dirty filters. The entire interior of the Dark House shall be completely cleaned of debris and vacuumed. The debris shall be stored in 55-gallon drums that are sealed, numbered and dated, and tested for hazardous waste as required.
- v. <u>Crime Scene Shoot Tank service required every six (6) months</u>, The Crime Scene Unit has a water-filled shoot tank for evidence testing. The shoot tank does not have a trap that needs to be cleaned by an outside entity. The only service needed for this location is Dlead wipe down/vacuum of all surfaces in the shoot room. The room is approximately 120 sqft.
- vi. <u>Indoor Range service required every six (6) months</u>, the Vendor shall completely remove granular rubber from the trap structure and proceed with lead removal. The Vendor shall replenish traps and hoppers with the clean granular rubber material as well as any additional material that may be needed. The front granular rubber slope shall be smooth with no excess material build-up or depressions across the entire front face of the trap.

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vii. <u>Dark House service required every six (6) months</u>, the Vendor shall completely remove granular rubber from the trap structure and proceed with lead removal. The Vendor shall replenish traps and hoppers with the clean granular rubber material as well as any additional material that may be needed. The front granular rubber slope shall be smooth with no excess material build-up or depressions across the entire front face of the trap.

- iii. After disposal of the lead and brass, the Vendor will notify HCSO Project Manager or designee via email to provide a certified and stamped ticket showing the weight of each collection. In lieu of the certified and stamped ticket, the Vendor may provide an onsite scale to weigh materials, which an HCSO employee must witness. If weighed onsite, the HCSO will maintain a logbook of the collection weights. HCSO will provide contact information to the Vendor.

- iv. The Vendor shall invoice the HCSO upon completion of each site visit. If lead and brass disposal is necessary during that site visit, a certified and stamped ticket or an on-site scale ticket shall display the weights. All credit for reimbursement shall be included on the same period's site visit invoice.
- 5. <u>HIDDEN DAMAGES</u>: When hidden conditions or damage are discovered after the commencement of Work, the Vendor must immediately notify the Project Manager or designee as to the nature and extent of the hidden conditions or damage and provide a written estimate of additional repairs needed. No additional Work shall commence until approved by the Project Manager or designee.
- 6. <u>FINAL INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE</u>: Final inspection and acceptance of all services specified for delivery under this contract shall be accomplished by the Project Manager or designee.
